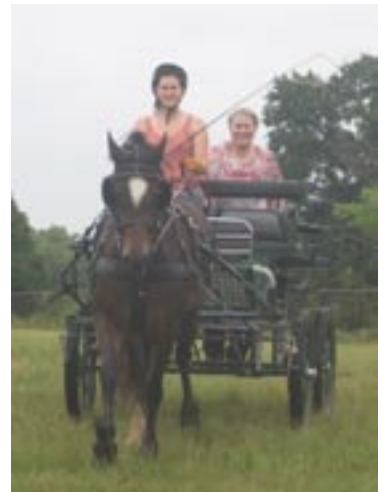


# HACA Swap Drive Meets Goals Despite Rain
